

With a chaperone, each child/group will observe the ducks, the river otters, Jester the male and Delta the female, and the monkeys in the Exotic Animal House.

You can observe the animals in any order and search for the scavenger hunt animals in between.

The chaperone can record the group's observations or answers.

Chaperones should read the animal signs out loud and encourage the children to read with you. Point to familiar words and look for answers together. Don't worry if you cannot find all of the scavenger hunt answers. Teaching, reading, predicting, talking, pointing, sharing, observing, etc are more important than getting all the blanks filled in.
